



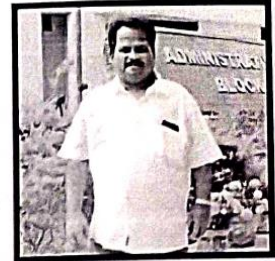

Preface

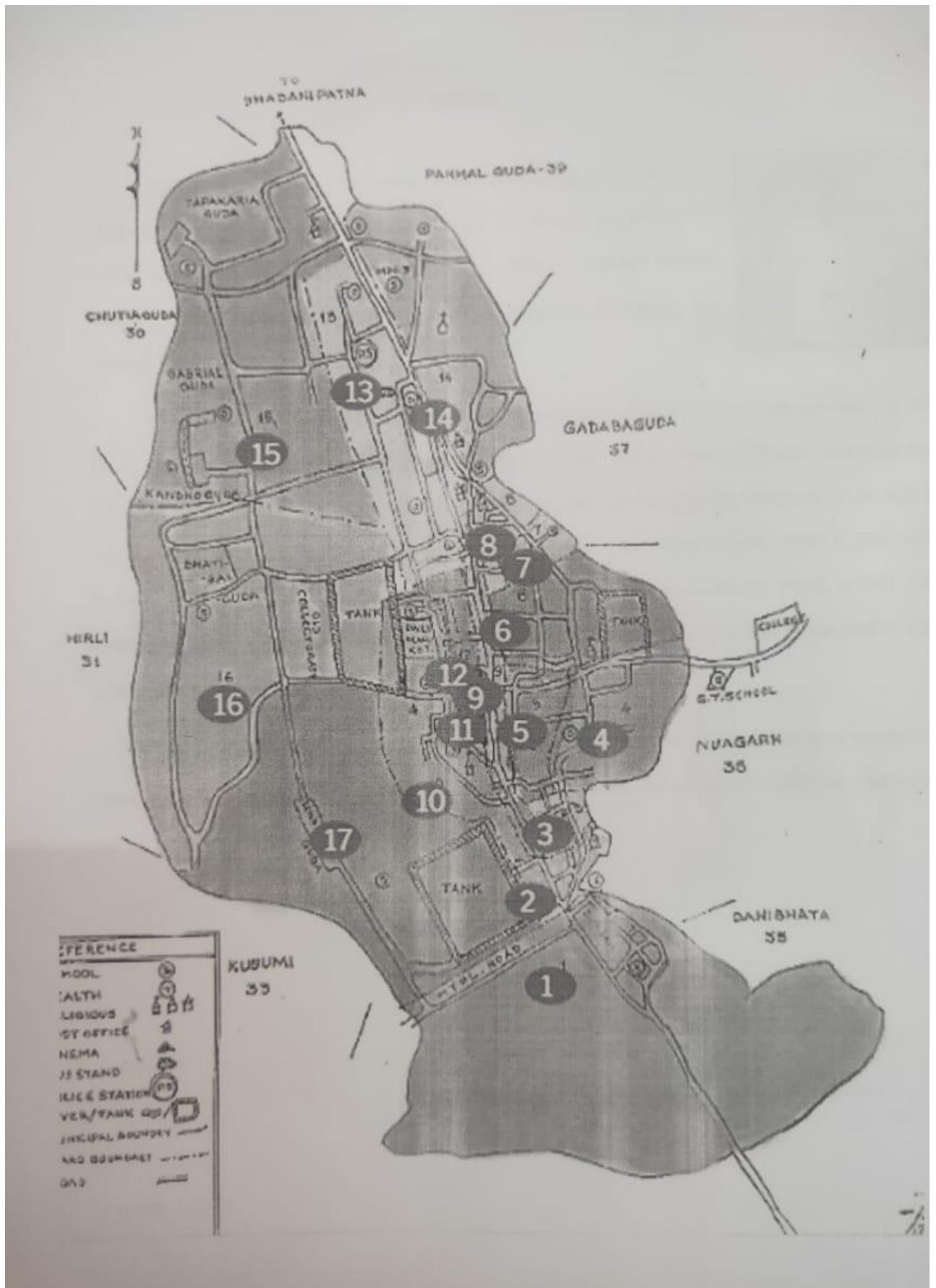

Chapter I

1.1 Overview of the Municipal Corporation/ Municipality/NAC

The Nabarangpur Municipality was formed as Union Board under the provisions of Madras Local Bodies Act 1920. Subsequently it has been converted to Notified Area Council on 01.07.1953 and eventually as Municipality on 20.07.1970. This Municipality is consisting of 3 Revenue villages namely Nabarangpur, Sadasivpur & Chamuriaguda with 3 hamlets.

The area of the Municipality is 21.004 Sq. Kms. The surrounding villages namely Nauguda, Podalguda&Hirli which are nearest to Nabarangpur Municipality are getting the urban facilities. As such these villages are required to be merged in Nabarangpur Municipality for improving the Revenue collection of Nabarangpur Municipality and for its strengthening.

Males constitute 53% of the population and females 47%. Nabarangpur has an average literacy rate of 79.1%, higher than the national average of 59.5%. Male literacy is 87.7 % and female literacy is 69.5%. In Nabarangpur 12% of the population is less than 6 years of ages. Out of which 3216 are SC, 3242 are ST and 21547 other population.

1.2 Area and administrative division

The area and administrative division of the City/ Municipality/NAC can be described using the following information

- The area of the Municipality is 21.004 Sq. Kms.
- The Nabarangpur Municipality was formed as Union Board under the provisions of Madras Local Bodies Act 1920. Subsequently it has been converted to

Notified Area Council on 01.07.1953 and eventually as Municipality on 20.07.1970. its Longitude is – 82.5491, Latitude is – 19.2277.

- This Municipality is 02 K.M. far from the Collectorate
- There are 17 nos. of Wards in this Municipality.
- There are 03 nos. of Vulnerability Wards in this Municipality i.e 01,,16, Nearest water bodies and distance from sea/rivers

Chapter VI

6.1 Reconstruction & Rehabilitation

Rehabilitation and Reconstruction are the quick recovery and back from the circles from Disasters by rebuilding of Infrastructures in a speedy mode. During the time of disasters period people are affected severely and comes under psycho-social pressure. Their mental conditions are not so good due to losses. So, proper rehabilitation them in safe places and reconstruction of their Infrastructures is an important process to overcome them from stress.

6.2 Post Disaster Needs Assessment

Housing:-

Housing to the vulnerable and affected farmers will be provided as per government norms under SDRF/NDRF. However, priority would be to include them in government Housing Scheme. Housing is the basic need of life. The disaster resilience housing will improve the economic condition of people and state at large. In post disaster situation damage assessment of housing along with land and settlements is also important for adoption of safe building practices. In PDNA policy makers will enlighten about the requirement housing also changes or affects the entire social, income and revenue sector. Further this will measure the immediate requirement relating to local building practices and resources availability.

Infrastructure:-

Infrastructure resilience is the better option to minimize the risk in case of hazard of great impact. If building and bridges are made as per disaster resilience norms then there will be less damage and community can easily cope up with the disaster situation. Improved resilience housing and other infrastructure such as road and bridges, drinking water system, irrigation , power, health, which will be helpful for community to “build back better (BBB)” in a shortest period. The resilience infrastructure also contributed to reducing the risk of livelihood of people and community asset and public asset. Since community is the first responder resilience infrastructure should be made developed as per post disaster need assessment, whether the geographical feature will be capable to sustain or stand in the aftermath of disaster.

Livelihoods:-

In PDNA above two sectors, i.e. Housing and Infrastructure depend upon the livelihood status of the community. As the purchasing power and economic strength defines the credit capacity of the poor people. There will be less option to choose livelihood option and opportunities. At the same time deteriorate the living condition more due to increasing in

the market prices. Therefore it is very important in PDNA to assess the livelihood condition of the people in affected areas to provide them immediate short term need and long term need.

- To develop understanding and general awareness of the insurance procedures

7.5 Long Term Mitigation Plan: (100 Words)

- Construction of bridges and embankments over the rivers and building of flood shelter near the flood prone areas.
- Moreover other safe shelters should be constructed at high land, with good communication facility.
- Telephone department shall be ensured and maintain uninterrupted communication system across the district, especially in vulnerable areas
- List of important telephone numbers will be made available to all concerned
- Solar Chargers with multiple charging facilities shall be in place in sufficient nos. for charging the mobile phones.
- Police Wireless Set to be placed in District Head Quarters and should be open for 24 hrs Before the monsoon strikes
- Physical verification of the status of all the drinking water sources and community toilets.
- Appropriate corrective measures will be taken based on the information, received by the verification team.
- Adequate water facility and distribution shall be ensured in all villages by installing new PHE connections and tube wells.
